

Installation Instructions

Root Barrier (20mil & 30mil) installed on a Green Roof with Keene Flash 4.0"

Materials Needed:

- 20 or 30-Mil Root Barrier
- Keene Flash 4.0" (flashing material)
- Utility knife or scissors

Preparation:

1. Ensure that the green roof substrate is clean, dry, and free from any debris or sharp objects that could potentially damage the root barrier.

Step-by-Step Installation:

1. Unroll the Root Barrier:

- Start at one edge of the green roof area and unroll the 20-Mil Root Barrier product.
- Roll out product in the direction you plan to install it, ensuring that it covers the entire surface where root protection is required.
- Cut around any drain fittings or necessary penetrations for designated drainage channels.

2. Position and Secure:

- Position the root barrier in place, ensuring it is properly aligned with the intended coverage area.
- No adhesive is necessary to secure the product, as gravity is typically an adequate force in a horizontal application.
- If desired, the root barrier can be fastened to the substrate using a form of construction tape or heat-welding.

3. Overlapping Seams:

• If multiple rolls of the root barrier are required to cover the entire area, overlap the seams of adjacent rolls a minimum of 3-6 inches. Ensure that the Keene Flash 4.0" is applied over these overlapping seams as well per instruction steps 4 & 5.

4. Seam Flashing:

For every roll of root barrier that you install, it is crucial to properly flash the seams using Keene
Flash 4.0". This step helps to create a watertight seal and prevent any potential root intrusion
through the seams.

5. Flashing Process:

- Measure and cut the Keene Flash 4.0" material to the desired length for each seam.
- Position the Keene Flash material over the seam between two adjacent rolls of the root barrier.
- Ensure that the Keene Flash material extends equally on both sides of the seam.
- Remove the release liner and press the Keene Flash material firmly onto the root barrier, starting from the center and working your way outwards.
- Use a hand roller or heavy hand pressure to further seal the Keene Flash onto the root barrier, ensuring there are no air bubbles or gaps.

6. Inspection:

 After completing the installation, inspect the entire root barrier systems to ensure that all seams are properly flashed and sealed.

7. Post-Installation Protection:

• Take precautions to protect the root barrier from potential damage during subsequent construction or landscaping activities on the green roof.
